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A Note from our President, Melissa Seyler

Dear Friends and Supporters,

Reflecting on the first half of 2026 at Feline Good Cat Rescue, I want to begin with my gratitude for the volunteers, fosters, adopters, donors, and community partners who continue to make this work possible. Every success we see is the result of collective effort, compassion, and commitment.

As we approach the nearly three-year mark since our founding in 2023, it's meaningful to pause and recognize how far we've come. What began as a small, volunteer-driven effort has grown into a structured organization with expanding reach, stronger systems, and a growing network of people dedicated to helping cats in need. While the heart of our mission remains the same, our capacity to serve has steadily increased through the dedication of everyone involved.

In 2025, the Board of Directors formally established four standing committees to strengthen our organizational structure and support the ongoing growth of our mission. These committees include the Foster & Adoption Committee, the Spay/Neuter Clinic Committee, the Fundraising & Development Committee, and the Marketing & Outreach Committee.

This year has also brought continued expansion of our community outreach and fundraising efforts, including events such as the Mardi Paw Party, Saturday at the IronPigs, and KittyPurrCon, as well as collaborative participation with Purr Haus's community events. These partnerships and gatherings have helped strengthen both awareness and financial support for our mission while bringing people together in celebration of rescue work.

Within our organization, we also continue to prioritize the health and wellbeing of the cats in our care through spay/neuter clinics for our rescued kitties. These efforts are an essential part of preparing cats for adoption and ensuring they are healthy, safe, and ready for their forever homes.

At the center of all of this work is the ongoing effort of daily rescue operations. Our Executive Director continues to dedicate countless hours to fielding urgent calls, coordinating intake, and navigating the intensity of kitten season, when the demand for support is at its highest. Her commitment ensures that cats in crisis receive timely care and that our organization continues to respond effectively to community needs.

Together, these efforts—from clinics and events to daily rescue coordination and committee work—reflect a growing organization built on shared responsibility and deep compassion.

We are grateful for the continued dedication of everyone involved in this work. Your support allows us to provide care, find loving homes, and build a stronger future for rescue efforts in our community.

"Not Every Story Ends the Way We Hope."

Goose's story reminds me why rescue work is about more than finding forever homes.

When Goose came to us, he had already been labeled "aggressive." His story had changed from person to person until all anyone seemed to know was that he wasn't wanted anymore.

What our team saw was something different. We saw a cat who was hurting. Hungry. Exhausted.

Instead of aggression, we found a frightened cat who curled up on a pile of towels in a quiet bathroom, slept for hours, ate every meal with enthusiasm, and simply needed a place where he finally felt safe. For a while, that little bathroom became Goose's sanctuary.

As time went on, however, it became clear that Goose's struggles ran much deeper than anyone first realized. Despite medical care, patience, and every effort to help him recover, his condition continued to decline. He began showing signs that his stress and suffering were overwhelming him.

Making the decision to let Goose go peacefully was one of the hardest decisions we've faced as a Board of Directors.

Rescue isn't only about happy adoption photos. Sometimes, rescue means giving an animal comfort. Sometimes it means replacing hunger with a full bowl, cold pavement with warm blankets, and loneliness with gentle pets. Sometimes the greatest gift we can offer is a peaceful goodbye surrounded by people who cared.

We might not have found another forever home for Goose, but we gave him what every cat deserves: **kindness, dignity, and love.**

His story reminds us why Feline Good Cat Rescue exists. Every cat matters. Not because every story has a perfect ending, but because every life deserves compassion.

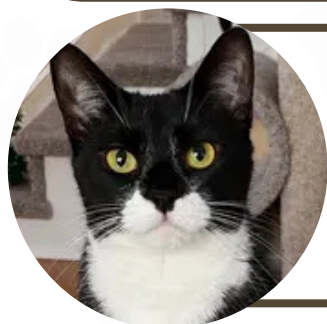
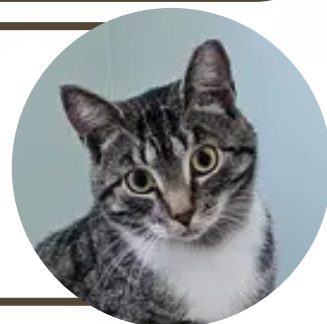

Expenses: \$19,900

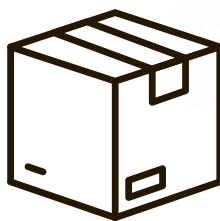
